FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



"The last enemy to be destroyed is death" 1 Corinthians 15:26

'The Amazing Miss Alice' - 1966 - 2018



Death creates a vacuum. It is our enemy and it is especially awful when it happens out of turn - to one so young. Death stole Alice from us. One of her sisters expressed it quite eloquently: 'There are people who make the world a kind and decent place. People who do the right thing, stand up for what they believe in, speak truth to power, believe in the potential of young, and befriend the friendless. Alice was one of those people. How could I explain that kind of loss?'

I was fairly new to the pastorate in Maryland, when Alice's father, Clarence, informed me that she was deeply concerned about the youth and was willing to start a youth group. I was thrilled and immediately invited Alice to discuss the plan over lunch. Unbeknownst to me, Alice had not volunteered to run a youth group and was surprised to learn of her dad's conversation with me. It was a classic Clarence move- the family described it as being 'Volun-told'. Rather than dashing my hopes, she accepted the assignment. Her moniker, 'The Amazing Miss Alice', followed soon after. She was amazing. The youth in her care flourished. As the years went on she assumed leadership positions in the church- serving on boards and committees. She inspired others to participate and became the cheerleader for new ministries within the church. There were instances when Miss Alice and I disagreed. We often reached impasses, neither of us wanting to back down. On one such occasion, when the disagreement had been particularly contentious, I learned, with chagrin, that I was on the wrong side of the argument. I promptly called her, and said, 'You have every right to tell me, "I told you so". Her response was incredibly gracious, 'No pastor, I would never say that to you.' Miss Alice was present at all 'her kids' milestones. When my son graduated from high school, she and her mother drove for 2 days to attend his graduation. She brought a choir from Maryland to sing at my 60th birthday celebration. She was amazing... and now she's gone. Death is an enemy.

This is why I am grateful to be on the 'other side' of Easter. Grateful that one day our enemy will be destroyed. Until that day, we are given new hope, that we are not separated permanently from our loved ones. I am so grateful for the life of the Amazing Miss Alice. I am so grateful that she said, 'yes' to God's call on her life. I am so grateful for her integrity and strength of character. I am so grateful that the God whom we serve has planted eternity in our hearts. Someday, faith will be turned into sight. Until then, we live in hope... New life awaits.




