The Ephraim Moravian Women's Sarah Circle has decided to make "Common Bread" our mission project. Justin Rabbach and Dan Miller are mission Volunteers from

Watertown, WI. They go to Nicaragua to help rebuild churches and to do other work. They are leaving January 6, 2011, for their next trip. We would like to raise money for their GENERAL CONSTRUCTION FUND to purchase supplies that will aid construction projects on the coast.

Your donation could buy a 5-gallon bucket to transport water, nails, or hammers. Some specific items to purchase are shovels (\$10), cement brick mold (\$100), wheelbarrow (\$25), school supplies (\$25), ball and Frisbee (\$10), and a ball pump (\$15).


