



verse of scripture cut out of the Daily Text. It's designed to be a guide and inspiration for the coming year. My Watchword for 2010 was: "See what love the Father has given us that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are."

-1 John 3:1. It was so important to me, that this slip of paper traveled with me from Maryland to Wisconsin.

Although you and I are told that we are children of God, we do need to understand what that means.

It means that, when I leave all the people I love and move thousands of miles away... I am not alone, or bereft, or without friends! I am a child of God and I'll find others who are part of his family. This has meant a great deal to me as I've moved far from family and friends. The love of God hasn't changed. In fact, because I know I'm loved, I can bravely face a new life and new challenges. I hope everyone who has to move away from home understands that we can never move away from the love and compassion of God. When you feel homesick and alone, remember that you are God's child.

It means that, regardless of the roles we play and the responsibilities we are given, we are always 'God's kids.' I can have expectations heaped on me yet not feel trapped because the God of the Universe considers me His child! This has helped me in my roles as pastor, mother, wife, sister and friend. I can always bring the burdens of my life to God and leave them in His almighty hands!

It means that I have an identity beyond my name, my nationality, my place of birth, my family. I am God's child. No one can take that away from me or minimize my life. When you feel caught up in everyone else's judgment of who you are, stand up and declare, "I am a child

of God!"

I don't know what the new year will bring for you, for me or for our church. I DO know one amazing fact. Our Divine parent will see us through the changes that this year will bring. I'm so glad we are His children!
