From Pastor Dawn's Desk

"Be exalted, O God, above the heavens. Let your glory be over all the earth." - Psalm 57: 11

If I didn't know better, I would say those words were penned here in Ephraim while viewing one of our magnificent sunsets. Every time I look over our harbor or drive through a tree lined road, it takes my breath away. I can imagine a poet writing a line like the one above when viewing such beauty... but, although I can imagine it, I know better. I know the setting for the words David penned. The heading of this Psalm reads: "To the leader: Do Not Destroy. Of David. A Mik-



tam, when he fled from Saul, in the cave." Do you remember some of the details of David's life?

David was a sensitive shepherd boy and a musician who was frequently called upon to play his harp for the troubled King Saul. His best friend was Saul's son, Jonathan. David was the youngest in his family. While David was living at home, the prophet Samuel anointed David to be King in Saul's place. Although this was done in secret, David gained fame when he defeated Goliath. Saul soon realized that David was favored to take his place. Saul used all the resources at his disposal to hunt David down and kill him. When this Psalm was written, David, with a small army of men, was hiding out in a cave... away from all that he held dear. What is even more poignant, is that David loved and respected the man that was intent on killing him.

It was within this setting that David pens these words of absolute joy and belief in God's greatness. These words can only come from someone who has spent his life in the presence of God. How we respond to injustice, personal defeats and illness will depend on how we conducted our lives during good times. David did <u>not</u> have an epiphany in that cave. His young life had been grounded in a daily relationship with God. All of his hopes and dreams had been given to God. When life sought to destroy him, he found a place of absolute security in God's presence.

During these summer months, let us make a point of walking with God each day. Whether it's at work or at play. Whether in the mundane chores of life or on a grand vacation. Let us begin each day reflecting on God's greatness and end each day in thanksgiving-even when the day has not gone well. Let Psalm 57 guide you this summer. May the presence of God become a reality for us all, this summer and beyond.

Our church had a booth on shore both Saturday and Sunday, selling Moravian sugar cookies, our


cook books, Moravian stars and note cards.



Voices From the Vault

Periodically the Moravian Archives in Bethlehem sends out their newsletter, "Voices from the Vault." In this issue, it's noted that they have a new acquisition at the Archives: a head covering worn by Moravian women throughout the eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries, a *Schwestern Haube* (sisters' cap), sometimes referred to as a *Schneppel Haube*. The Archive's *Schneppel Haube* is the only 18th century *Haube* they are aware of in the Lehigh Valley.

We use replicas of them here on special occasions. The word *Schneppel* refers to the shape of the cap which forms a pointed peak or "beak" in the middle of the forehead. By 1825, the caps were out of fashion except for the older generation.
