From the Pastor's Desk

During the summer months, I shared some stories of my years on Staten Island. Some of you may remember this story. I'm repeating it here because the question is often asked- Why is it that God refuses to answer some very reasonable requests—Especially in light of the promise in scripture: "Ask, and it will be given to you".?

Our family lived in an area of Staten Island that was crime ridden and over crowded. We had to be diligent about locking our cars. Even with that, sometimes our cars were vandalized right in front of our home! Our house had only 1 bathroom, no shower (unless you count the rubber shower hose we attached to the nozzle) and a very uneven heating system. My sister's room never got above 55 degrees in the winter. In the summertime, it seemed to absorb heat. For years my mother prayed that we would be able to move into a better home in a safe community. For many years the prices of those homes were completely out of reach. However, when my sister and I were in our teens, it looked as if our prayers had been answered. A house was for sale in a beautiful part of Staten Island on a tree lined street. It needed a lot of cosmetic work, but otherwise was ideal and the price was within our means. My parents put a deposit down immediately. Linda and I were overjoyed at the prospect of having the entire upstairs to ourselves with our own bathroom. We had chosen the paint colors for our rooms when we were hit with the bad news. An inspection of the house turned up serious foundational flaws and my parents withdrew their bid. We were very disappointed. My mother, undaunted, prayed even more fervently.

One day mom told us that she was not going to pray for a new house. She had not gotten discouraged or run out of hope. Rather, she announced that God had given her a one word answer: "Wait". She said it was painful, but we had to trust. I was not as sanguine. I figured God just didn't like us as well as people in those nice houses. What would be so wrong for us to have a home that was safe and comfortable? We never did get a new home on Staten Island. My parents sold the home and moved out of state after retirement.

Many, many years later, I understood God's answer.

In the ensuing years, after our hope for a new house was dashed, I walked into Vanderbilt Ave. Moravian Church and my life was transformed. The church was around the corner from my house. Had I moved miles away, that encounter would never have happened. I would not be a Moravian. Perhaps I would have even missed my life's calling. My parents were blessed by the love and care given them in the Moravian church. My sister, Linda, had dropped out of a Nursing program in college and switched

her major to Business. She needed to earn some money so she walked down the street from our house to the local Nursing Home, which happened to need Licensed Practical Nurses. As a result of Linda's experience there, she realized that her life's calling was indeed nursing and re-enrolled in the program.

Now, whenever I visit Staten Island, I stand outside my old home and pray a prayer of thanksgiving for the antiquated plumbing, the cramped quarters, the rough neighborhood and all the blessings that house brought to me and my family!

STEWARDSHIP REPORT

January 1 - September 30, 2011

We have received \$100,851 in income (2011 budget of \$118,260)

We have spent \$103,258 (2011 budget of \$139,885)

(note the shortfall of \$21,625 between expected income and expected expense)

CAPITAL FUNDS PROJECT

As of October 18, we have \$155,267 in pledges and donations. Of that amount, \$136,974 has been received in the bank.
