
#### **Congregational Watchword for 2012**

#### From the Pastor's Desk

#### Reflections on our Watchword for 2012:



What I love about Paul's letter is, that although he probably shares their belief that Jesus is coming soon, he re-directs them to consider how they should live until that time. It's good advice for all of us: How do we live, until we die? Here's what Paul tells us to do:

- 1. Live with our wits about us: "Let us be sober" which means that we think clearly and deeply about our lives, personally and corporately. We do not leave our brains at the door when we come to worship. Almost every denomination has an institution of higher learning. The Bible teaches us to use our intellects when we approach issues, not given to rash words or judgment, but being willing to stretch our understanding. That's why we engage in Bible Study, continuing education, and seminars. This year, let us do all we can to live soberly--looking for every opportunity to learn.
- 2. Be "bulletproof" "Put on the breastplate of faith and love." The breastplate is an ancient defensive shield. A modern day "breastplate" is the bulletproof vest. Faith or trust in God shields us from disappointments. When all of our hopes and dreams are vested in the God of the Universe, how can we be defeated by disappointments? People and institutions are bound to fail us, but God's power and grace is invincible! Coupled with Faith is Love. Sheer force may subdue enemies for a season, but Love conquers all. Let us find ways this year to disarm even the crankiest person with a loving attitude and kindness.
- 3. Use head-gear "For a helmet, the Hope of Salvation." Hope is our most powerful resource. It is Hope that gets us through the darkest times. Our faith tells us that each day can bring healing, forgiveness, joy, peace regardless of the circumstances. Let us be a beacon of hope for this church, our families, and our community.



As of December 22, we have **\$162,962** in pledges and donations for renovations. Of that amount, \$146,847.42 is in the bank (we have paid out \$1,922 so far on the construction).
