From the Pastor's Desk

"I was a Stranger..."

Every time I have a Sunday off, I attend a local church. I do this for three reasons.

- 1. It gives me the opportunity to get acquainted with more members of my spiritual family;
- 2. It gives me an opportunity to support my fellow/sister clergy;
- 3. I believe one should always attend worship because you never know when God might show up! (and since I preach this, I must also practice it).

Thus far, I've been able to attend 8 worship services. All of the churches told me, in one form or another, that they were 'warm and friendly.' In fact, a welcome was extended in all 8 churches from the pulpit. Yet, if I were looking for a church home, there were only 3 out of the 8 that I would be willing to consider.


In two of the churches, fellowship was offered after the worship service. In both cases, I was personally invited, by parishioners, to accompany them to the fellowship. They stayed with me as we waited on line and engaged me in conversation. I felt at home and 'warmly' welcomed. At the church that did not offer a fellowship hour, I was not only greeted warmly, but also had in-depth discussions (beyond "hi, nice to see you here today") after worship. In all three churches, the congregation sang with joy and conviction. In all three churches the laity took significant roles in the worship service. I sensed joy and life in these congregations. In one of the churches, I was having a very difficult time following the service. It was conducted without announcement and I just couldn't figure out where we were! A nice lady came and sat next to me and helped me negotiate the service. Afterwards, we had a wonderful conversation. I would have happily gone back to any one of these churches.

Now to the churches which I would not attend: In one church, the sermon and music were excellent. The right hand of fellowship was extended. However, before and after worship, I was completely invisible. The best preaching and music cannot overcome a cold reception. I noticed that families were engaging in conversation with each other. They must have felt that the church was a friendly place. But, as an outsider, I was not extended any of that warmth. In fact, in all of these churches the sermons & music were good. The missing ingredient was the offer of hospitality. In another church, I came in early and noticed a bunch of people in a room sharing laughter and fellowship. I found in the brochure that fellowship hour was taking place. No one, not even the assigned greeter, invited me in to the gathering. In that same church, 2 people did extend a friendly greeting and conversation... I found out they were also visiting.

Do you see how important that personal invitation is? We have a golden opportunity this summer season. We'll be hosting many people who will walk through our doors because our church is part of the story of Ephraim. What will they find? A group that really likes each other? - I hope so! A worship service that is meaningful? - I hope so! Good Preaching? Great Singing? But, more than that, may they find hospitality and genuine conversation. Let's make it a point, this summer, to engage people on a deeper level, as we get to know more members of God's extended family!




Women's Tea & Garden Party ~ April 25

The Trustees met on April 12 and discussed work proposed at the Cemetery... the steeple repairs... roofing on the back part of the church building... work in the upper hallway... the front doors... and the rest of the progress in construction.

It was noted that unless we reach our goal for capital funds of \$200,000, all projects with the exception of the parsonage bathrooms (in progress) and the steeple will need to be put on hold.

A wedding for the fall was discussed, the purchase of a new vacuum cleaner and TV for the nursery, the basement door repair, reviewed the Treasurer's Report.

Treasurer's Report

Renovations Report - One project to be completed is the downstairs bath in the parsonage (in progress), then the steeple renovation. We currently have \$60,576 remaining in the Remodeling Fund account, with the following projects to complete:

Finishing of bathroom - \$6,500 Renovation of steeple - \$35,000-\$50,000 New shingles on back roof - \$15,000 Paving upper parking lot - \$11,500

Parsonage foundation repair - \$4,500 \$72,500 - \$87,500

While we have some people who pledge support on a monthly or quarterly basis, you can see we will have to put off some of the projects until we fulfill our \$200,000 goal.


