From the Pastor's Desk

The Open Door

"I know your works. Look, I have set before you an Open Door which no one is able to shut." - Revelation 3:8

As you know, I'm having the time of my life here in Ephraim. I get a kick out of people being able to come into the church without setting up an appointment or asking someone for a key. This is the first church I have served where the doors can be left unlocked during the day without fear. What a blessing that is. It's not that all the people in Door County are exceptionally honest, it's that we are few in number and our friends the deer and wild turkey are not interested in church wares! We also have the unique distinction of living on a Peninsula. If any person 'runs amok,' the bridges in Sturgeon Bay can be raised, leaving escape routes cut off.

When a group of us traveled down to the Divine Word Pentecost Lutheran Church in Milwaukee, I thought of the challenges of an "Open Door" ministry in an urban setting. How can a church possibly minister in the midst of so many daunting challenges?

The church that John wrote to in Revelation was a struggling church facing many closed doors. Anyone professing Christ risked economic, political and religious persecution. But John's message to the early church was that God had an Open Door for their ministry. I'm sure the people of that time protested as we do today - there's not enough money, time, interest, strength, political influence to sustain the ministry. And yet, the church not only survived a time of great upheaval, but also grew exponentially. God's purposes are not thwarted by our circumstances. There was a challenge, however, in the promise of the Open Door. The challenge was that the church of Jesus Christ had to be faithful in order for the promise to become a reality.

Our brothers and sisters at Divine Word Pentecost are being faithful to the ministry that God has given them. They share the gospel with the children of the neighborhood. They share food and clothing with the dispossessed, they tutor in schools whose funding has been cut. They provide opportunities to grow through music and art. They refused to leave the city for 'greener pastures'. And we, the Church of the Open Door here in Ephraim have a unique opportunity to help those laboring in the city. We can help by praying for and participating in projects to keep their building in good repair, so all may find a haven.

We've asked our friends in Milwaukee to send a list of priorities for our mutual work. Once we receive this, we'll be asking you to be a part of the work, either through prayer, donations, physical labor, driving, food gifts, etc. There's a part each of us can play. Please pray for our brothers and sisters at Divine Word Pentecost, that each day, God would reveal to them the "Open Door". And let us be an Open Door in our labors together, for God's kingdom!

There will be lunch served at noon!




MISSION POTLUCK and PROGRAM ON HONDURAS
