From the Pastor...

“When God Makes No Sense”

It is easy to trust God when life makes sense. We expect that when we do what is right, we will be blessed by God. We expect that good will triumph over evil. We expect to see the sun in the morning and the moon at night. We trust that in the dead of winter, spring will come (eventually!). But there are those times that God does not make any sense. We see this in the lives of 2 people featured in Luke's Christmas stories, Elizabeth and Zechariah. They are described as 'blameless' and 'barren'. If people are good, we expect that good things should happen to them. Elizabeth and Zechariah were righteous people. They observed all of God's commandments. In their day, barrenness was a sign of God's displeasure. Knowing that Elizabeth and Zechariah were people of obedience and faith, I am sure that they prayed for many years for a child. In old age, however, the prayers must have stopped and, rather than becoming bitter, they accepted their childlessness. But it must have been difficult to endure the sidelong glances, the judgmental attitudes and their own heartache. Sometimes, God doesn't act in ways that we expect.

But Elizabeth trusted God when God made no sense. She continued to live a 'blameless' life. When she was way beyond childbearing years, she received a delightful surprise. Unlike her husband, who questioned God's timing and promise, Elizabeth, in full trust, welcomed God's intervention. When she realized that she was pregnant, she said, “This is what the Lord has done for me!” (Luke 1:25a).

The stories of Christmas do not make sense. God entrusted penniless teenagers to be parents of God's Son. The King of Kings was born in poverty and subject to the whims of despot monarchs. The first people who recognized the Messiah were foreigners and outcasts of society. When I think of the preparations that go into the birth of our children, any of us could have done a better job orchestrating this incredible event!

I hope, in this season of God's great surprise, we continue to trust that the God who loves us, who gave us a gift beyond measure, will give to us hope, peace and joy, even in the seasons of life which make no sense. May these thoughts give you strength!
