From the Pastor's Desk

On New Year's Eve, we draw 'watchwords,' which are scripture verses that we hope will guide us throughout the new year. The verse drawn for Ephraim Moravian Church, 2014, is Romans 15: 5 – 6. What a wonderful guide for us!

"May the God of steadfastness & encouragement..."- We serve a God who is 'steadfast'which means unwaveringly loyal. God will not leave us when life turns us upside down. God will not abandon us when we fail. God will always be with us. If our God is steadfast, then it's incumbent upon us to reflect that in our relationships. The people of God must never give up on anyone. We are steadfast in all circumstances, meeting every need, knowing that God will supply the strength and the resources. We serve a God of encouragement. This is the way we are to respond to failure, not with blame or 'I told you so,' but with the encouragement that characterizes God's grace. If God is gracious with us in all our weak moments, we can certainly encourage others in their times of disappointments.

"Grant that you live in Harmony with one another"- This does not mean that we will always agree! It does mean, however, that we find a way to bring God's kingdom of grace and light to this community. We might not agree on methods or means, but we will encourage each other to do our very best to promote God's love. When I was a younger pastor, I came up with what I thought was a great idea to solve a space problem we had for our Sunday School. I pitched it to the trustees of my church. One promptly said, "Pastor, that's the stupidest idea I've ever heard!" I snapped back, "Oh, yeah, you got a better one?" He said he did. It was a much better idea than mine! Rather than fight over the method, we got behind his idea and solved the problem. Living in harmony means keeping our focus on God's will for us.

"So that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ"- Praise is not for God's sake. God does not need to know that God is great. Praise is something we need. As we praise God, we are reminded of the grace that brought us to this point. When we praise, we look beyond our problems and grief to the presence of Jesus.

May God grant us, this year a tenacity of spirit and unwavering loyalty to each other and to our entire community. May God grant us, this year, a spirit of encouragement, especially to those broken in spirit. May God grant us, this year, a spirit of Unity so that we may rise to every challenge...together! May God grant us, this year, a spirit of praise and joy!

2014 Annual Budget

<u>Income</u> - Budget of \$195,088 (with available balance from 2013) (2013: \$151,775) <u>Expenses</u> - Budget of \$173,844 (2013: 167,189)

<u>Notable changes</u> - the general congregation will be picking up some expenses that the Moravian Women used to cover such as kitchen supplies, donations to Caring Hands and Loaves & Fishes. The advertising budget has been increased for 2014 to allow more publicity and ads for special programs, the Anderson Docks-ology, etc.

Fundraising activities show an equal amount for income and expense (\$1500) since none are scheduled until the Outreach and Fundraising Committee is formed.
