From the Pastor....

"I waited patiently for the Lord, he inclined to me and heard my cry. He drew me up from the desolate pit, out of the miry bog, and set my feet upon a rock, making my steps secure. He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise to our God. Psalm 40: 1 - 2

"STUCK" (Adapted from a recent sermon)

A friend of mine was walking around her property during the Spring thaw last year, when she stepped into a muddy expanse that held her feet like glue. No amount of force could shake her loose from the mud, so, she had to wiggle out of her boots and crawl out of the muck. You can imagine the mess! She was safe, but the boots were a total loss. We all know the feeling, don't we, of being stuck. We can get stuck emotionally, physically and spiritually. It seems that we are all stuck right now in the never ending cycle of winter weather. I have been stuck for more than a month with a cane and back brace, waiting for the day when I can stand up straight. Being stuck is very frustrating!

The person who wrote Psalm 40 gives us some advice when we are stuck. Take time to read the Psalm today. The first piece (and probably the most difficult) is: Wait patiently for God. This does not mean that we sit around, doing nothing, waiting for rescue. To be patient means that we are tenacious in our faith and steadfast in our deeds. While we wait, we continue to serve and love God. Secondly, the Psalmist advises us to steer away from destructive habits. It's tempting to do something, even if it's wrong, because we are tired of waiting for God and are willing to do anything to change our circumstance. His third point is: bargaining is useless. Many of us try, including myself, but when you think about it, what can we possibly offer Almighty God in exchange for what we want? Although we cannot bargain with God, doing God's will gives us the grace and strength that we need during these difficult times. On the last day of Martin Luther King, Jr.'s life, with absolute faith and conviction, he said, "I just want to do God's will." He then declared that he would not live to see all the changes he envisioned, but that God had given him a glimpse of 'the promised land.'

The great promise of this Psalm is in the opening lines, when the Psalmist declares that God brought him up from the miry bog and set his feet on a rock! We will be delivered! And when we are, we must talk about it, so that others who are stuck will be encouraged. After the Psalmist's deliverance, he encountered another problem for which he needed God's help. Life is cyclical. We may get delivered and then get stuck again! But through it all, we have God's promise of grace and deliverance!

Are You an Organ Donor?

If so, wonderful! Your organs and tissues can help someone else live when you pass away. But here are a few facts you may not know:

If you have an 'organ donor' dot on your driver's license and are in an accident, the police may take your driver's license for a time and no one would know immediately you wanted to be a donor. So if you go to YeslWillWisconsin.com, they'll get you registered as a donor, and donation professionals will see your name on the list and work with your family to honor your decision.

You should not rule yourself out as a donor for any reason--if you've had cancer or another disease, for reasons of age, etc. Donation professionals will review your potential to donate organs or tissues and determine suitability.

Donation does not disfigure the body or delay funerals--donation is a very careful surgical procedure for the donor as well as the recipient and does not rule out even open casket situations.

Donor families are not charged for organ donation, and the medical team that works to save your life is completely separate from the donation professionals who recover organs and tissues so there is no conflict of interests.

Success rate is very high, and there are over 28,000 organ transplants and 1 million tissue transplants in America each year. It has become a standard medical procedure.

Our Joyful Noise Offerings for 2014

Church Council decided on the following Two organizations to receive our Joyful Noise offerings this year - each will receive six in total, every other month.

Loaves & Fishes headed by Kay Wilson and involving
many of our members and those of
other Northern Door
churches, they serve
a free hot meal every
fourth Tuesday



through the year. Door County's Loaves & Fishes is in its 8th year, serving over 5,300 people to date. Each monthly meal costs between \$150 and \$200, and volunteers are always needed for planning, purchasing ingredients, and preparing the meals. Last year, Loaves & Fishes received \$587 from the Joyful Noise offerings here.

<u>Secret Santa</u> - This is an organization started by Jane and Jennifer Lee. Jane said "The idea started with a Hallmark movie, where a



poor man secretly gave to townspeople every year. The first year, we helped one family with heating costs. Last year we helped 20 families." Secret Santa anonymously pays the heating bills of needy Door County families, even paying for a new furnace or water heater if needed. "There is a lot of need out there," says Jane.

Communion on March 2:

At times our rituals can become so ingrained that we can't see the wonder and joy in the gifts of God. To help us deepen our experience of the Lord's supper, we will make a change for the March communion service. Instead of singing hymns while communion is being served, we will be given an opportunity to listen and quietly meditate. This will not be a new "tradition," just a small change every so often to rekindle the depth and meaning of the sacrament.



With the women of the church focusing on fellowship and spiritual growth specifically for women, a **Women's Committee** needs to be formed to plan and execute any events they plan--spring/summer/Christmas luncheons, prayer breakfasts, women's retreats, etc. Ladies, if you feel that these activities are important in your life and the life of the church, please talk to Pastor Dawn or email us at the church to volunteer to be on this committee. You can be in charge of just <u>one</u> event, if you like!

An **Outreach and Fundraising Committee** is being formed to fundraisers and special concerts in conjunction with the Music Committee, and outreach events. 

Not too much to report in the first two months of 2014. For January, we fell short of our expenses by \$5,500; but with the combination of weather keeping people away and increased heating needs, it was not unexpected. And of course we had funds in the bank at the start of the year (\$47,000) to cover expenses.

Remember that even if <u>you</u> can't make it to church for any reason, your tithes and offerings still can - ask your bank about electronic giving. It's easy, safe and can be arranged weekly, monthly, or in any manner you would like.



There is a very substantial, round table in the Parlor that the church no longer needs. Is there anyone in our congregation who could use it? (p.s. delivery not included)

It's a very nice table. Take a look at it on Sunday and make your wishes known! Otherwise, it might go down to the Re-Store or to Bargains.

Are you up for the challenge??

Habitat for Humanity will be building a home for a local family in Egg Harbor this year! It is rare they get donated property north of Sturgeon Bay, and they are asking all the Northern Door churches for help. Each home takes \$100,000 (plus many hours of "sweat equity" by the family and volunteers).

There is a matching fund grant available to us at Ephraim Moravian that will match all donations up to \$2,000 from our congregation. We will be collecting during the month of March (mark your checks made out to EMC for "Habitat" in the memo section), and Kerry Krauss will be here on March 16 to tell us more about the project.

You can also help by

- Donating your time at the home site with hands-on work, food for breaks for the workers
- Talking to others about donating land in Northern Door for future homes here. There is a need!
