Our Evolving Mission - God has Been Busy at 55th and Lloyd



Updates on capital expenditures (furnaces, well, kitchen, basement, basement doors)

- --All measurements taken in the parsonage kitchen; cabinets being constructed
- --Outside door to the basement will be replaced soon
- --New well will be drilled soon (tests even after chlorination are coming back with coliform bacteria, so DNR wants a new well--we will probably put in a UV system, as well)

NEW WAY of doing offering envelopes for 2015

For those who have been consistently giving each week, you will still receive a box of envelopes (<u>not</u> numbered, however, so be sure - if you give cash - to write your name on the outside so you get credited for the offering)

For those who give bi-weekly, you'll pick up a packet of 26, already sorted out For those who give monthly, there are packets of 12

They are all on the pew outside of the sanctuary for you to pick up.
