Pastor's Page: A Tribute

Last week a good friend of mine died. His name was Don Winters. He was a classmate of mine in seminary and served in the Southern Province of the Moravian Church. When I met him in 1982, I was single, living with my sister and beginning my seminary studies in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. I was fascinated with Don, because, unlike me and most of my peers at seminary, Don was an actual grown-up! He had served in the military, had a successful career with a prominent newspaper in North Carolina, and was married with 2 children. We had nothing in common. From our disparate accents, our backgrounds and experiences, we formed an unlikely friendship.

I guess we bonded because we both felt like aliens on a strange planet. We did not speak the language (I remember being perpetually confused by the lectures from the professors and the speech emanating from my peers. I thought my brain had atrophied from the few years I spent away from the college classroom); we never felt like we 'fit in' to the profile of those preparing themselves for ministry.

Don was a wonderful friend. My sister and I had terrible luck with cars and needed to be rescued frequently- off exit ramps, in isolated areas with no gas station in sight, etc. We always called Don and he always came, cheerfully. His wife, Mary, was a travel agent and he was very excited to accompany her on a business cruise. Afterwards, he described his adventure in great detail. On eating frogs legs for the first time, he declared that they 'tasted like chicken.' We studied together, commiserated together and sought each others advice. One time I asked him to listen to a tape recording of a sermon I had preached. I had followed one of my professors' advice and wrote the entire sermon out, put it in a binder and preached from the manuscript. After listening to the sermon, Don handed me the tape and said, "Dawn, that was JUST AWFUL — what were you thinking???" Now, lest you think him unduly harsh, I was never gentle with him when it came to critiques! Isn't that a wonderful gift of friendship? True friends will provide uncensored feedback, and, since we understand it comes from a place of unconditional love, we can receive it. It's because of Don that I realized I had to find my own voice and style of preaching.

It was not easy for Don to leave a good job and uproot his family to obey the voice of God. He left a good life, in order to secure a better one. A life that had an impact on so many people. I am grateful that I had such a friend. I am grateful that I will see him someday in the Resurrection Morning. Until then, I have wonderful memories and a fine example to follow.

Greetings from the Moravian Church in Uganda

It has been nice hearing from you at a time when the Church is engrossed in seeking avenues to address some of the most pressing needs in our congregations.

On behalf of the members of the Moravian Church in Uganda, allow me to express my heart felt gratitude and thanks through you to the Board of World Mission North America and the Congregation that provided this donation of USD 800. It is a blessing.

Upon notification about this donation, the Board of the Moravian Church in Uganda convened a meeting to decide how this money can best serve the communities where the church is active.

A number of ideas were advanced ranging from an increment in the number of needy children supported to attain education; securing a piece of land for congregations affected by land evictions; addressing Violence against women through training of community resource persons, as well as supporting evangelism activities through enabling our local pastors to reach the most needy populations.

At the end of this meeting, it was resolved that since most of the challenges that the Church is facing are related to lack of resources, the fund be utilized for the establishment of an income generating activity through which some of the most pressing needs could be addressed sustainably.

To this end, the Board has come up with an idea of a piggery project which can be managed by members of the Church. It was proposed that the fund be used to build a pigsty, purchase piglets, feeds and treatment. Pigs are marketable in Uganda.

It is anticipated that with this foundation, the Church will be able to address some of the pressing needs through proceeds from this venture.

About the ministry, I have attached a copy of our annual report for 2014 for your con-

sumption. We shared this report with Rev. Dr. Jorgen Boytler during his historic visit to Ugandan Ministry. (posted on our upstairs bulletin board)

May the good Lord continue to bless you and your ministry.


Meet James Heroux

If you haven't read these letters of life in very early Ephraim, it is a wonderful read. Check it out in our library (inside Pastor Dawn's office)




