Pastor's Page:

When I taught third grade many years ago, there was one subject that caused me to break into a cold sweat. I knew that the 8 year old children in my class were more advanced than I in one subject... Art. Any type of Art. Drawing, coloring, painting, sculpting, sewing... When I would introduce an art project that I could competently teach, my students would groan and say, "that's kindergarten stuff." It was not pretty.

In Middle School my feeble attempts at sewing caused my peers to double up with laughter; even my kind teachers giggled as they pulled the stitches out, smoothed out the jagged seams and restored the fabric to the intended design.

In High School I flunked ceramics. My creations would make a Neanderthal cry. I was fortunate to have a friend with me in the class. After each disaster, she would reshape the clay and make it into something beautiful for me.

In my adult years, I gamely showed up at craft classes — I guess I'm a glutton for punishment. It did not take long for the participants in those classes to realize that I was a menace with sharp objects and glue guns. But each group would rework my disasters so that I could take something home that was, if not perfect, at least able to be displayed without horrifying the onlooker.

You can imagine my discomfort when I joined the new Quilting group here at Ephraim. I forewarned our leader that she might have to sacrifice me for the greater good. All the others in the group displayed lovely projects that they were working on. Each person understood basic concepts—sewing on machines and by hand, measuring, using scissors, etc. As our leader explained a 'simple' quilting pattern, I was recoiling in horror. One group member saw my discomfort and assured me that even first graders could quilt. I realized that my failure here would be even more humiliating! I was relieved when I sat down at the sewing machine and did not run a needle through my finger. I was even happier when I sewed a basic pattern and it came out fine. It helped that our instructor had chosen the fabrics, measured out the strips and stayed with me step by step as the quilt square became a reality. I can proudly display my first square!

In my misadventures with all things artistic, I've learned a valuable lesson about God. Just as the people around me cleaned up my feeble attempts and helped me to fashion something beautiful, so God, in all of his kindness and creativity, can restore beauty and grace to our lives. In Ephesians 2:10, Paul tells us: "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works." Next time we think we've made a mess out of things- whatever it is, let's give the mangled project to God, and ask him to rework it. May God's grace bring restoration and beauty to us all!
