FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



"I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me." - 2 Corinthians 12:9b

One of my values is competence. I push myself to be competent in my work and I expect competence from others. I want my work to shine. When it doesn't, I certainly don't 'boast of my weakness'. Perhaps you share my aversion to concept of weakness. Do you revel in your weakness? Do you embrace your incompe-

tence? I bristle at the idea. But I have to admit, there was a time when, because I was so incredibly inept, I saw a clear demonstration of the grace and power of Christ.

I had completed my second year of seminary and was thrust upon unsuspecting souls in a local nursing home as a student chaplain. The nursing home had several floors, so I was assigned to one floor for the summer. One of my tasks was to initiate personal conversations with each resident and write a verbatim. As you can imagine, the conversations were awkward, stilted and usually onesided. One day I entered another person's room to inflict my brand of hospitality. Her name was Theresa. I felt I was interrogating the poor woman, asking questions which led to monosyllabic responses. I found out that she had never married and rarely ventured out of her room. In a feeble attempt to connect, I mentioned the street I lived on. Her eyes lit up and she asked for my full name. In a moment of joy, she said, 'tell Celia (my mom), that Terry Berger says hello'. I had never met Terry before, but had heard her name mentioned many times. Mom met Terry at her very first job, and they had been friends ever since. Even when they could not see each other, they exchanged cards and letters. The latest Christmas card my mother sent was returned with no forwarding address. Mom wondered what had become of her dear friend. And here I was, in a nursing home where my floor had been 'randomly selected', reconnecting in spite of my ineptitude. What followed was a summer filled with grace, laughter and shared memories. My mother regularly saw Terry and even managed some trips with her outside the confines of her nursing home. During the summer I took her out of her room everyday to survey the gardens. I marveled at the grace of God that brought us together. Terry died later that year in peace and the assurance that she was beloved.

Sometimes, in our quest to be competent, we are afraid of reaching out. We'd rather be absent than inept. But, I hope my story assures you that God can use even the most awkward encounters to minister grace and peace. When we are weak, Christ indeed, is strong! - Pastor Dawn


