FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In high school I had a very close friendship with Selma. She was funny, sarcastic, brilliant and artistic. She and I were inseparable. We shopped, talked on the phone for hours, did homework together and went on outings. We shared everything... except our faith. She had been raised in a church, went through confirmation and then completely repudiated all she was taught. I couldn't blame her– God had disappointed her in so many ways. She had a terrible home life. She was the oldest child. Her parents were



divorced. Her mother made unreasonable demands on her and her younger siblings reflected the chaos of the home. She admired her father, but sometimes, for no particular reason, he would greet her with stony silence. By 15 years old, she found a job that would keep her away from her house. Between her interactions with me, school and work, she spent most of her day far from home. I tried to talk to her about Jesus. I invited her to come to church, all to no avail. Her mind was made up– God was dead.

During our college years, I made another attempt to invite Selma to church. We were hosting a special guest speaker - Corrie Ten Boom, who had endured a Nazi concentration camp for hiding Jews in her home. Corrie Ten Boom had lost everything, including most of her family. Selma agreed to attend because she was interested in history. At the end of Corrie Ten Boom's talk, in which she spoke about light shining in darkness, she invited people to come to the Light. To my amazement, Selma responded. She was filled with peace. Within a year of this incredible event, Selma and I lost touch with each other. She went to graduate school and I left the area. With the advent of Social Media, I tried to find my long-lost friend, but to no avail. She didn't have an on-line presence- none of the groups I connected with knew where she ended up. I found out a few weeks ago that Selma died last year. It made me very sad, until I discovered that the joy and peace she received many years ago stayed with her until her journey ended. For the last 23 years of her life, she was a principal at an orphanage school in Mexico. I found a picture of her from that orphanage. She looked exactly the same as she did in high school, down to the jeans and sweatshirt. She was reading a story book to the children and her face radiated joy. The simple invitation that I gave to her changed the trajectory of her life. God didn't rescue her from her circumstances. Through Jesus, she received Immanuel - God with Us. The God of all peace, comfort and Joy guided her to discover her purpose in life. She was given a new family that honored and respected her. I am so thankful that we are given an incredible gift- not a gift that rescues us from difficult circumstances- but a gift that promises us Immanuel, "God With Us" today, tomorrow and beyond. May each of us walk in that hope this day! - Pastor Dawn


