FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

When Lurching from One Crisis to the Next...

Have you noticed that crises usually come in rapid succession? I have seen this phenomenon many times. We barely have time to 'catch our breath' before the next crisis arises. It is an occupational hazard in my profession. We may have months of relative calm and then 'all heck breaks loose'- illnesses, death, family crises compressed in a short period of time. It is then that I find myself lurching from one crisis to another. Here is what I have learned - I hope these lessons will help you when you're experiencing a tsunami of trouble.

- 1. Before chaos ensues, impose order- I am keenly aware that there are many things beyond my control. However, I can order my life so that I am not in a perpetual state of anxiety. This is why I work ahead in quiet times- having bulletins ready, planning things well into the future. I never know when I will be yanked out of my routine. When disruptions occur, I am not scrambling to do the ordinary tasks they are done and I can focus on the current disaster. Perhaps, in your own circumstances, you can structure order so that crises do not overwhelm you.
- 2. Find a place daily to meet with God Jesus always found time, even during the most hectic days, to find a quiet place to commune with God. When anxieties overwhelmed his disciples, he was the essence of calm. I am reminded of a story in Mark's gospel. Jesus and his disciples were in a boat when a fierce storm arose. The little boat was taking on water. But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, 'Teacher do you not care that we are perishing?' He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' Then the wind ceased and there was a dead calm. Mark 4: 38 39 Lately, I have allowed myself the luxury, in the midst of clamoring need, to plop myself in my recliner and take a restful snooze. I do so knowing that my anxieties are not an accurate predictor of outcomes. I know that I am in the presence of the one who stilled the winds and the waves, whose absolute trust caused him to fall fast asleep while others wrung their hands.

My prayer for you, dear friends, is that God will give you the strength, grace and peace to face every crisis life hurls at you. After doing whatever it is you can do to impose order, when things spin out of control, may you rest, without anxiety, in God's perfect calm.



We serve lunch to between 20-60 people each day that we are open. (There is no rhyme or reason as to which day is our busiest!) It's delightful to watch neighborhood kids come in as our first customers every Saturday morning for hot cocoa and muffins. We even had local adolescent and teen neigh-



bors come in on their days off from school last month (during exams) and volunteer for several hours (!) in exchange for a meal! We've also found that our Agape Meals (on Thursdays at 6pm) are expanding to include more neighbors. There really are many cheerful hearts at Tricklebee. And the food is amazing, thanks to our stellar cooks: Tanya Ingvoldstad Otero and Retona (Toni) Wilson! We couldn't do what we do without (com)passionate staff and dedicated volunteers.
