FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I enjoy greeting tourists who walk into our church during the week. I give them the 'nickel tour' with fun facts about the building- how it was built on the shore and rolled up the hill. I proudly show off our beautiful stained glass windows, Iverson's pulpit and the art work. But, as you know, there's so much more to the story:

Ephraim Moravian Church was founded in 1853. Unlike many 'church starts', our church did not begin with architectural drawings, building permits or dignitaries yielding shovels during photo-ops. It began with a group of immigrants, seeking land to build homes, raise children and maintain fellowship with each other through their shared faith. The community's life revolved around their faith in Jesus. As they worked, they found time daily to gather for prayer. They supported each other in every aspect of their lives, from home-building to commerce to education. The first schoolhouse in Door County was built by the Moravians, with land donated by our founder, Rev. Iverson, who was also the first Superintendent of Schools for Northern Door.

Life was not easy for our ancestors. It is sad to observe that the cemetery was established before a church building could be raised. The most poignant tombstones list the names of young children. The church building took years to construct due to lack of funds. We owe much to the tenacity of our forebears, who continued to create a life, not only for themselves, but for those who enjoy this beautiful village.

We are now housed in a beautiful building, with a magnificent view, in a picturesque town which attracts many visitors. We are beneficiaries of the faith and hope of all those who preceded us. But the church is more than the pews we sit in, or the history we cherish. The church is the people of faith who continue to support this community in all aspects of life-commerce, education, emotional and spiritual development. Our faith does not end at the doors of this church. We have an opportunity to bring honor to the legacy given to us by seeking the welfare of our neighbors in this wondrous place we call 'home.'


