### Answers to Prayers Unspoken

A few weeks ago, my husband and I took a trip to Illinois for a reunion, of sorts. My father-in-law, Bob Sr. and his wife Patty, gathered 2 of his children, all his brothers, sisters plus extended family to meet his eldest son, 'Mikey.' When Bob Sr. was 19 years old, unbeknownst to him, he fathered a son. Mikey learned his birth father's name in 2011. With no other information, he began his quest to search for his other family. Through his wife, Loo's, unwavering support and encouragement, and the miracle of DNA testing, Mikey located his father. Now, my father-in-law has a large family by modern day standards- Bob, Jr, Michael, Lisa, Stephen, Louie + grandchildren. But, when he heard there was one more... he threw open his heart and arms to embrace his first born. He
