FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Welcoming the Family

I recently received a gift in the mail from a couple who visited our church in 2011. They had spent some time traveling around the country, making a point to attend worship wherever they went. They were



familiar with Door County, but had never been to our church. They felt led by God to join us in worship. On that particular day, Pastor Ken Carlson was in the pulpit. They wrote a book about their experiences: "Church on the Road: Adventures in the Big Family of Faith"- Rob & Nancy Nason. They kindly gave their permission to quote from the book:

It was good to be a little early- we had the opportunity to get acquainted and hear some of the church's history... We were surprised to learn that the Moravian church, a Protestant church, had been in existence for sixty years when Martin Luther posted his famous theses in 1517... Modern Moravians share a common body of beliefs with all Christians. When it comes to the doctrinal differences among denominations they say it very well: 'In essentials unity, in nonessentials liberty, and in all things love.' It was with great joy and thanksgiving that we joined this part of our Family at Ephraim Moravian. We were welcomed like the brothers and sisters we are, and we sang, prayed and worshipped together. We heard an inspirational sermon on the 'litmus test' of our faith, the depth of commitment that Jesus asks of those who follow him.

With God's leading, we began our day in fellowship with other members of our Big Family, and had a great Lord's Day in the Door!

We have a unique opportunity due to our location and history. Virtually every Sunday, we are blessed with visitors, some of whom have never heard of Moravians. We serve as ambassadors each week- not only sharing the history of our church, but more importantly, welcoming people home, if only for a brief moment. We have a mission, every Sunday, to demonstrate the finest values of our Moravian Heritage. We can make each Sunday memorable and blessed- for our familiar friends and newly found family.


