# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



I must admit that even I found our Winter/
Spring weather a bit much. The picture on the left was taken on Sunday, April 15. Sushi and I were walking up Willow Street at the height of the blizzard. She was willing to brave the pelting snow--I was not. We never made it up the hill. I snapped the picture and turned back toward home. It seemed like Spring would never arrive in Door County. Even now, with

warmer temps at the end of April, piles of snow remain.

But I do see signs of Spring. Small green shoots are appearing. I shed my winter coat for a light jacket. The ice is thinning in the harbor. I know, through several seasons in Door County, that although the Spring/Summer season takes longer to appear than in most areas of the country, it

always returns... every year, without fail. The same can be said regarding our personal winters - when the sun refuses to shine, the cold seeps into our bones and we can't find any signs of life. 
