FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The early 1950's were difficult for many of our citizens. Before the Civil Rights Act of 1964, people of color were shut out of good jobs, basic human rights and protections against violence. Although we lived in the North, which had no Jim Crow laws, the best jobs and neighborhoods were for 'whites only.' My parents tried their best to instill values of inclusion and justice. They voted in every election for people they felt reflected their values and dad volunteered to canvass neighborhoods and serve as an election captain. Although they were not in a political or economic position to deal with the injustices of their time, they taught me a great deal about what ordinary people can do.



Before I was born, my parents took in a foster child. With 3 boys of their own, they hardly had the time to care for another child, but they were approached

because a little girl desperately needed a consistent, loving home. When 5 year old Helen arrived, she had been bounced around to several foster homes. No one wanted Helen. She and her siblings were separated when mom could not care for them. She was a very angry, confused child. Soon after Helen's arrival, mom became pregnant with her 4th child (me). My parents refused to give up on Helen. Dad told me his philosophy: 'I am the father of every child under my roof and they are all treated the same.' Helen stayed with us for 2 years. My parents were instrumental in returning her to her family. Helen never forgot them and, anytime she visited, she was their daughter (sometimes she wasn't happy when mom and dad laid the law down!). They changed one child's life.

We are living, this day in difficult times. The headlines fill us with dread and distress. Who among us has not been shaken to our core when we hear the sounds of children crying inconsolably for their parents? Who among us has not been stirred with compassion for people who are victimized by crime or disaster? But what can we do- besides posting our distress on Twitter or Facebook, thinking that somehow our voices are being heard? My advice is to follow my parents example - they were not paralyzed by the headlines - they did what they could in their own context. So, do what you can... Vote, support candidates which reflect your values and most importantly - find someone who needs you. In the summer time we see young people from all over the world. They serve in our restaurants, hotels and retail establishments. If it weren't for our foreign help, many businesses would not be able to open. They are thousands of miles from home. You can make a difference in their lives. You can represent to them all that is good about America. Our Bridges program needs American Connection Families. An American Connection family befriends one or more kids, invites them to dinner, takes them shopping, etc. You may not be able to change Washington D.C., but you can change a life here in Door County. More information is within this newsletter. Be the difference in one person's life!



BECOMING A MEMBER OF EPHRAIM MORAVIAN CHURCH

1. Who is eligible for membership? Anyone who faithfully attends the church and desires to join may do so.

2. What is expected of members? *Faithfulness in presence, time and support*

3. Once I am a member, do I have to join a committee? No, but you are expected to be an 'ambassador', both within the church: welcoming and engaging each other according to your gifts, and outside of the church: modeling Jesus to all whom you meet. Some of our members are active on non-profit boards, school boards, village boards, etc. All our work should be a reflection of God's grace.

IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD ...

Our Partners at the Urban Gathering Center are asking for our help. Their first summer evening camp is hoping to host 80 children to enjoy wonderful weeks of programming and fun with help from Tricklebee Café. The cost to families will be very low so that no one will be excluded. They are looking for 80 people to give \$80 to sponsor one child. Will you help? A few of us are involved in **Bookfriends.org**, which was started by Jendean's college roommate 14 years ago based in Wauconda, II. We make sanitary pads and pouches to hold them, and they are shipped with books to areas in Africa to allow the girls to stay in school.

While you're spring cleaning we can use: 100% cotton fabric, and fabric that doesn't ravel (knit, felt, etc), thread, and 1/2 -5/8" buttons. There is a box at church to place them in. They can also use cotton, sturdy briefs (girls 12, 14, 16, and women's 6, 7). Any questions, see Barbara Classen or Vicki Maynard.
