FROM A PASTOR'S DESK

The Door County YMCA recently hosted a "Senior Health and Wellness Day." Not that I qualify for any such program, mind you, but I decided to sneak in anyway because they had a session on "Laughter Therapy." I didn't know quite what to expect, but in no time the presenter had us waving our arms and stomp-



ing our feet and doing all kinds of silliness that normally I would avoid at all costs. But soon, \everybody in the room was laughing like crazy. It gave credence to the fact that "laughter is contagious".

We were told that 10 minutes of laughter is equivalent to two hours of jogging. By that standard I can get a whole week's exercise in by laughing for 20 minutes. Of course, I wouldn't have jogged in the first place. Back in the 60's and 70's, noted author Norman Cousins lived an astonishing 25 years after being diagnosed with a very painful and deadly disease. He lived that long because he laughed at the disease and pain and demolished their affect on his life.

There is no question that the world in which we live is fractured by fear, suspicion, hatred and a whole host of debilitating situations. But I assert that laughter is palliative and cleansing. If we can see the light side of life we discover that we are more alike than we are different. Laughter and humor could be called the "connective tissue" between people. And I can tell you one thing, when I join the Church Triumphant, I would rather laugh uproariously for one day than sit for all eternity with dour and pious people.

So, where am I going with all this? If we look for it, we find that the Bible contains more laughter and mirth than we might have thought. When Abraham and Sarah were told that they would have a son when they were well into their nineties, it caused them to have some knee-slapping belly laughs at such a proposal. When their son was born, they named him Isaac, which means "laughter."

Biblical humor is also subtle. Take, for instance, the day the Pharisees tried to trap Jesus into condemning an adulterous woman to her death by stoning. Jesus deftly threw it back on the Pharisees by saying, "Alright, whoever among you is without sin, cast the first stone." Can't you imagine Jesus walking away, chuckling under his breath and whispering "Gotcha?"

The most astounding joy and laughter occurred when Jesus got the last laugh. By the power of his death and resurrection, Jesus destroyed death and opened the way to forgiveness and Grace and eternal life. That life is now! Both in our laughter and our tears.


They can also use cotton, sturdy briefs (girls 12, 14, 16, and women's 6, 7).

Voices from the Past

From the Pastor's Diary- May 6, 1980

The present pastor, Wolfram Fliegel, had not intended to continue the practice of keeping the congregational diary, as the diary had not been kept here for 9 years and most pastors had no desire to do this. I had thought it worthless to go through the effort when my successor most likely would let it drop. I thought a sporadic diary of little value. A chance conversation with Bishop Kortz in Bethlehem makes me take up the practice again. Maybe my successor will look upon the diary again with favor, not as an account of 'having worked today in the office' or a record of Sunday's sermon title and choir piece, but as a record of historically valuable events, a reflection of the life of the congregation and the recording of what goes on in the community we serve, omitting for posterity, the names of sinners and possible adversaries. But highlighting, by name, those who have done something of lasting and outstanding benefit to all. The Moravian church is blessed with rich historical records of the past, largely due to the importance our forefathers placed on the diary. Sunday bulletins and newsletters do not, and cannot, reflect the life, the victories and the defeats, the joys and sorrows, of the local congregation. So here goes...


