FROM A PASTOR'S DESK

Here in Door County we have a quandary of sorts. We welcome strangers as our guests, while at the same time making our living off them. Most of our guests are great and good people simply wanting a respite from hectic lives. They seek a bit of time to reconnect with their families and have fun with them, but also to take advantage of what Door County provides. It truly is rewarding to help people, and most of them are very appreciative.



But then there are those who are difficult and demanding, who make the lives of the workers and the waitstaffs less than fun. Some years ago, our daughter Angela worked as a server at Wilson's. Wilson's is a happy place though very hectic, but the employees do their best to make it a place of fun.

One time, Angela waited on a group of people out on the porch at Wilson's who were demanding and rude, to put it mildly. Then, when they finally left they did so without leaving a tip, but then they stiffed Angela (and Wilson's) by walking off without paying their tab. Angela noticed this, of course, and chased them way down to Anderson Dock. One wonders if people like that are hiding some sense of inferiority that causes them to act that way.

Then, we must mention the churches. Attendance at Ephraim Moravian church swells during the tourist season with repeat visitors and new seekers, some of whom are just curious to find out what on earth a Moravian is. Bear with me here: You may be surprised when I say that the church charges admission, too. Not by collecting the offering as you might think, but rather the price of admission is to bring your need for spiritual renewal or to seek guidance. It could be to seek counsel with a difficult decision. Maybe it's something frightful that consumes you, like a grim medical diagnosis. We ask that all these issues be placed at the feet of Jesus - and left there.

The price of admission to God's Grace and forgiveness is this: Let go! You are no longer a stranger to God's Love. Welcoming the stranger is no small task. Jesus demands that we do it. And I think Ephraim Moravian church is doing a spectacular job of doing just that.



Americans for Better Hearing Foundation

The Americans for Better Hearing Foundation works with the State of Wisconsin sponsored TEPP (Telecommunications Equipment Purchase Program) to provide free hearing assistance equipment to individuals who qualify. They provide the Audi-Pro System, which is a pair of Doctors' Choice ear-links that work like hearing aids and will connect to the church's hearing loop system. The system also connects with cell phones and improves the ability to hear on the phone. There is only a WI residency requirement to participate in this program and there is no cost to the individual whatsoever for the equipment. Voices from the Past

An Excerpt from the Diary of Wolfram Fliegel, July 1984

July 13-

The village is holding its 2nd annual historical walk today and tomorrow. Was asked to dress in a swallow-tail shirt Bill Weborg had and made my appearance in it in various places, top hat and all. One man asked if I'd been drinking that early in the day, 9:30 a.m.. I pointed him to Ephraim's historic walk. Quite a few people came by the church.



July 14-

A sing-along tonight, after the historic walk, also sponsored by the Ephraim Foundation.

Ted Hoeppner led it, Bernice Koehler played the piano. Lots of 'golden oldies.'

Ted had copied them at church. It is something the village had many, many years ago each summer. I believe every Saturday night. About 40 people showed up and the sing-along came to an abrupt end when a summer storm came up very suddenly and all scurried home to check windows, etc. The storm knocked out electricity in much of Northern Door.
