FROM A PASTOR'S DESK

As a Lutheran Interloper looking on, I can say it was a delight to read the results of the recent "Charting Our Future" forums. Not one to be accused of being shy, I feel compelled to present some observations that are informed by not just a few years of parish ministry. First, it speaks well of the congregation to have had so many participants at the meetings. If you take the number present as a percentage of the average Sunday morning worship attendance, the result is very striking. Though it's a fluid measurement that is influenced by multiple factors, the average Sunday attendance is essentially the number of active members in the congregation.



Though there aren't many surprises in the responses recorded, it must be said that the attendees provided a snapshot of what Ephraim Moravian Church is in the present moment. The results present an unvarnished view into what's working, as well as what might work better. It's very clear that there is a healthy balance of ministry that is done within the congregation itself and that which is provided to the larger community. In addition, I believe It's good to think that a suggestion offered not be considered a criticism in a negative sense.

No doubt the spirit of cooperation and hopefulness was very evident at the meetings. It wouldn't surprise me if the groups even had fun.

But now comes the time to put on the full armor of God! Now it's time for nitty gritty stuff. It is my prayer that the congregation doesn't think it can tackle everything at once. That's a set-up for certain failure. Good conversation, prayer, discernment and sometimes a battle of strong opinions will lead you to carve out the best and most reasonable goals. Then, go after those things as though your life depended on it. Which, in fact, it does. Start tomorrow!! No, Start today!!

Successes and setbacks will likely abound. Certainly, there will be times when you seem to be only groping your way along. As Paul says in 1 Corinthians, "for now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known." It's true that "Without a vision the people perish" but Ephraim Moravian Church clearly has been given the gift of energizing sight!

Voices from the Past

From the Diary of Rev. David Jones November 1961

Nov. 17- Invited to the Women's Circle meeting at the church. Explored need of stranded migrants from Florida at Roen's Orchard, Ellison Bay. Detained because of a murder of one of their number, these people reported suffering from winter weather. Took some warm things over to them.

Nov. 19- Installed Sunday School Staff. Holy Communion in commemoration of Chief Eldership of Christ. Announced predicament of migrants and a generous response came from many sources. Mrs. Valentine and my wife came along and we delivered a good carload of clothing and some staples.

Nov. 20 - Another trip to Roen's orchard with clothes. Went to Radio Station WDOR to record 2 devotionals.


