# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### "Suitable Gifts"

My friend, Cory, is a strong, independent woman. She faces every challenge with a spirit of optimism, utilizing her resources to find creative solutions. She happens to be partially sighted and knows how to describe her condition so that she can obtain the assistance she needs, especially in unfamiliar surroundings. A few months ago, I picked her up from the airport and found her quite frustrated. On three separate occasions, while requesting specific directions, rather than



listening to what she actually needed, airline personnel offered her a wheelchair. Being quite capable of carrying her own person and luggage, she took offense. Wheelchairs are marvelous conveyances for people with mobility issues. But a gift offered when not needed is tactless. What she required was someone to help her with landmarks so that she could 'see' her way to the gate.

On her return trip, the first plane arrived late and she had very little time to board her flight home. As the first flight landed, she spoke to the other passengers about her dilemma. In her own words... *I shared my concern, that being partially sighted I needed a map in my head, good directions and a clear path to make a run for my gate through the airport construction, carrying about thirty pounds of luggage. As long as I knew where I needed to go, I believed I could make it in time. It was then that Alexa, the woman in the seat in front of me, said, "I'll run with you." And so she did. We raced straight out of the causeway, into the corridor, headed left and didn't slow down for a good block and a half, weaving our way through the crowds, before I needed to notch down to a really fast walk. Alexa checked her watch: I had four minutes to make the gate before they shut the door. Then, she grabbed a wheelchair. I hopped in, threw my bags on my lap and grabbed her bag to pull alongside as she pushed and ran. Throughout our journey she chanted; "Running, running! Walking fast, walk-ing fast! Wheelie chair, wheelie chair! Excuse us, excuse us!" We moved; people eased out of our way. And because of her support, I made my connecting flight home with time to spare.* 

In one story, the wheelchair was an insult, in the other... a Godsend. In this season of giving, let us remember that the most valuable thing we can give to another is a listening ear. It is only then that we can offer suitable gifts of time, material goods, conveyances and friendship. We are blessed in this season to receive the most suitable gift of all, Immanuel... God with Us.



### Voices from the Past From A. Iverson's Diary, p. 126

So here we are Christmas Eve, 1861. The Christmas tree was more beautiful, the gifts more numerous and more expensive than ever before, for all of which we could thank faithful Sister P. Johnson, her efforts being untiring. The church bell chimes called softly the dear little ones and the young people to the Lord's house. And to be sure they were not tardy in coming and they were ready and willing to sing most wonderfully the Christmas verses.

At a fixed hour, I found a large number of children and young people, as well as parents, present. The Christmas tree seemed to smile with its many lights and gifts and to beckon to the dear little children's sparkling eyes and every child must have realized that this was their festival and their celebration.

The clear voices of the children rendered most beautifully the introductory song. Then followed prayer, a great many kneeling, after which the fascinating and ever new story of Christmas was read in Luke 2: 1 - 20; and then another song and the declamation of many precious quotations (and none of them made a mistake). A peculiar holy mood seemed to come over all of us. A few verses were sung and then I began my Christmas story to the children and the young people, all the while feeling as if my heart was melted within me...It followed, therefore, that the children, young people as well as grownups, each and everyone, prayed to the dear and precious Christ-child and unreservedly surrendered their hearts for all eternity.
