FROM A PASTOR'S DESK

OPEN DOORS

Door County got its name through rather ominous circumstances. The name comes from what is known as "Death's Door", the stretch of water between Washington Island and the door Peninsula. These are dangerous waters by any standard. The bottom of these waters is littered with the hulks of many ships that sank during the 1800s. But a remedy was at hand. Through an enormous effort of human hands and mighty machines, the canal as we know it, was dug from the Sturgeon Bay to Lake Michigan. It was a doorway to safe passage.

Voices from the Past

Excerpts from Pastor John Greenfield's Report to Church Council, January 4, 1898

Our congregation, which two years ago consisted of 130 members, has become two organized churches, composed one of 116 members, the other of 70 members; total 186 members, making a gain of 56 members. The finances of the church have also greatly prospered. Two years ago we met in our old church building with a debt of some twenty dollars. One year ago we met in a new church, free of debt and with a slight balance in our favor.

But the greatest blessings of the year have been the evidences of the Holy Spirit's presence in our midst, convicting and convincing the sinner and keeping the believers in the faith of the Son of God. We cannot thank God sufficiently for the blessings received in our Bible readings, prayer meetings and other services. Our heart's desire is for continued outpourings of the Spirit of Grace and Supplications.

By the help of God your pastor has been enabled to conduct almost all the regular and also many special services during the past year. He has conducted 14 funerals, 2 weddings, baptized 20 infants and children as well as 2 adults.

He wishes to thank the Board of Elders, Trustees... for their faithful and efficient service. He desires all the societies of the church, such as Christian Endeavor, Ladies Society, Willing Workers and Little Gleaners to know that he highly appreciates their abundant labors.
