FROM A PASTOR'S DESK

Just lately I have come to realize I am surrounded by "essential workers". That's a description which has entered our parlance of late, thanks to the coronavirus epidemic (more about that later). But for now, I would like to center our thoughts on "essential workers" and "essential work". How am I surrounded by these things? For starters, Jendean and I are such workers. That's what marriage is all about. For 53 years now we have labored in the vital work of forgiving and forbearing. Our younger Son Aaron and his wife, Sarah, and their three little ones were with us for about ten days at the end of October. Then add to the mix Andrew and his daughter, plus Daughter Angela



and husband Chad along with their two daughters. So, all told, that adds up to 13 essential workers, most often gathered, delightfully, at our dining room table. What was significant to observe was the labor of love shared by everyone. It is notable to watch the essential work of good parenting, of cousins doing their important work of playing well together (mostly) and of Grandparents being duly proud. Another essential work was the whole family cheering Aaron on as he ran from Gills Rock to Sturgeon Bay, without stopping. Obviously, he takes after his father!

The gist of all this is to point out that we all are essential workers to and for one another in our families and in our work and daily lives in some form or fashion.

Which brings me back to this Covid thing. To say we are sick and tired of all this is a spectacular understatement. Who would ever have thought that we would all walk about looking like masked gunmen? Before now who had ever heard of social distancing? This disease is terrifying and devilishly sinister. There is risk in simply going about our daily business. It is precisely this risk that has endangered the lives of those who are truly our essential workers. It's the clerks at the store, the police and fire-fighters, teachers and preachers, the doctors and nurses, the ambulance crews, and yes, the morticians. These one and all, and those seen and unseen, who are the frontline essential workers of our time.

Preeminent among all essential workers is Jesus our Lord. He risked and gave His life so that ultimately disease and death will have no sway with us. It is through and by His power and presence that we are given the grace and power to maneuver through the risks and dangers of our lives. And ultimately, it is His essential gift that ushers us to eternity. The celebration of Thanksgiving is soon upon us. It reminds us to be grateful. Through it all, it is essential that we do so.

October Reports from the Board of Elders & Trustees

<u>Elders</u>: The Elders met on Wednesday, October 14. Agenda items included new, in-person organ concerts beginning this fall and plans for Christmas programs. ADVENT-ure will be a drive-by event on Saturday, December 5. Moravian sugar cake, boxwood heart kits, and early pick-up of wrapped candles for 12.24 are all options for members. More information can be found in this newsletter. Pastor also reported on her ministry including recent baptisms, burials, and ongoing visits with people in Scandia Village. A new virtual Bible study is planned for winter, 2021. If you have any questions, feel free to contact an Elder. Thank you!

<u>Trustees:</u> Discussed that although we won't have poinsettia sales this year, we will do a memorial/tribute page for those who'd like to make a donation—all donations will go to Door CANcer. Noted that we've had six new members since we've been shut down due to the virus!

We are slipping behind in offerings both from members and, more obvious, from visitors. There will be a letter sent to the congregation mid-November regarding our total income and expenditures to date.

The church and parsonage now has monitored wired-in fire alarms in all parts of the buildings, as well as ionization units in place for the main part of the church. Air purifier units will be purchased for the upstairs rooms and nursery.

Budgeting for 2021 was discussed (including working with the 2020 Budget until life returns to 'normal') as well as possible ways to hold Church Council in January. We are in the process of getting our \$27,000 "PPP loan" forgiven so that money can go against salaries and utilities as we kept our staff in place. There is also a Provincial COVID relief amount coming.

...MEMBERS OF THE MONTH...



After a cramped and uncomfortable night elsewhere, they drove through Ephraim and found a room at Ephraim Shores. A year later they were looking for a place to go with two sons and their infant daughter. Why not Ephraim? Thus, began summer vacations in Ephraim. The rest is history.

Rob and Barb were married at Second Presbyterian Church in Indianapolis, IN and celebrated 31 years of marriage at the start of the Covid-19 lockdown. After her high school graduation in 1943, she enlisted in an Army three -year accelerated nursing degree program at Milwaukee's Deaconess Hospital. Graduating in 1946, with the war over, she was released from her active duty obligation.

Betty began her nursing career working at the VA's Wood Hospital in Milwaukee for two years before returning to Ephraim to help run Eagle Inn during the summer months. She accepted nursing positions in Sturgeon Bay and other areas during her long nursing career. In 1962 Betty and Bert with their spouses (Bill Overbeck and Gloria) bought the Eagle Inn from the family and ran it until 1978 when it was sold. After her retirement, Betty enjoyed volunteering throughout Door County. Betty is now living at Cardinal Ridge in Sturgeon Bay and has enjoyed the outdoor visits from family during this challenging time. Her son Glenn lives in Sturgeon Bay. Betty celebrated her 95th birthday on October 27th.
