FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you.
- Luke 6: 27

Last Sunday I spoke about mercy. If you remember, I reflected on the story of Jonah and his displeasure at God's mercy toward the enemies of



his people, Nineveh. We can certainly relate to Jonah's displeasure. I know I've cut people off for far less provocation than Jonah had with the people of Nineveh. I'd like to share a story from a friend of mine, recalling how her dad, 'the enemy', was treated in World War II.

When I was about 5 months old, my father was deployed as a German soldier in Normandy. He was captured shortly after D-Day and brought to the United States as a prisoner of war. He spent most of his imprisonment in Savannah, Georgia. I was 2 1/2 years old when my father returned.

He was lucky to have been captured by the Allies, because most of the soldiers that were captured by the Russians were not so lucky and most of them did not return. Even though my father was a prisoner of war, he never mentioned that he was mistreated and he formed a relationship with one of the Sergeants at camp, and they stayed in contact. When my parents came to visit me in the US, we located him and he came to visit my father, it was such a joy to see this. I stayed in contact with them for many years. Because my father was treated humanely, he encouraged me to emigrate to the United States. I came here as a young adult, became a citizen and raised a family. This is my home.

We are blessed each day with God's mercy... in abundance. We receive forgiveness for our failures, we are given second chances. May we find it in our hearts to treat those with whom we've had sharp disagreements, with dignity, respect and mercy. - Pastor Dawn



We got our second PPP loan for expenses, \$28,300, which we are anticipating will be forgiven as a loan and become "ours" to help pay for expenses in 2021.

COVID-19 UPDATES FOR EPHRAIM MORAVIAN CHURCH

Vaccinations: We urge all of you to get vaccinated when available for your age group. Pastor Dawn & Bob have had their first round and have scheduled their second shots. They report that the process was easy and reactions mild.

Once you're vaccinated... Please Note:

1. Masks and Physical distancing are required.

The vaccine's efficacy continues to be evaluated. There are many unknowns, including whether vaccinated people can still infect others. We must be patient as these variables are studied.

- 2. In person Church Attendance- currently, the number of infections are too high in Door County to invite people inside our building. Here's what we can expect going forward:
- a. When the infection rate is below 5%, Pastor Dawn will once again invite lay readers to participate in the service. If the rate remains lower than the 5% threshold, we'll be able to invite a small group in for Sunday worship (like we did during Advent). We may also be able to put on some in person concerts.
- b. If we are still unable to open the doors to the church building by the summer, we will resume summer outdoor services and bible studies (masked & physically distanced)

According to the Wisconsin Council of Churches post on January 14, 2021:

Vaccinations completed in WI: 26,708/5.8 million = 0.45% Cases/100K population = 59 (7 day average) Positive COVID tests = 28%

These are far above the threshold for safe gathering. In light of these statistics, and the new, more highly transmissible COVID variant which is now circulating in the US, we recommend that churches abstain from gathering in physical space, indoors OR outdoors, at this time.

It is recommended that gatherings can safely take place when 70 - 85% of the population is vaccinated.
