Reflection: "Choose the Best Language" - by Barbara Axelson

There is a puzzle that runs in the daily newspaper which encodes a famous or pithy quotation disguised within the letters of the alphabet. Recently, Mark Twain was quoted as saying, "Kindness is the language which the deaf can hear and the blind can see."
