Reflection for Easter Sunday - by Pastor Dan G. Olson

Jesus was no stranger to darkness. It was likely in the dark of night that Jesus was born in Bethlehem. In the stealth of shadows, Joseph and Mary scurried to Egypt to protect the infant Jesus. It was in gloom that Jesus experienced the death of his cousin, John the Baptist. It was in grief Jesus received news of the death of his friend Lazarus. What could possibly be more bleak then the inexorable journey to Jerusalem that would end at the hill of death?

We, too, journey through life with the shades pulled down around us, blocking light from our lives. What are we to do when our lives go off the rails? Yes, life possesses its own outer darkness.
