If you become infected with Covid-19 and have recently come to a worship service, please call the Pastor at 920-421-4042. Your information will be kept confidential, but we will let members know (without using your name) in the event they need to get tested.

Nursery is open to your children. If one child in the family is ill, please keep the entire family home. Only fully vaccinated adults may be in the Nursery.

If you are eligible, please don't delay in getting vaccinated. You'll help yourself and the community. If you are having difficulty scheduling one, the pastor is available to assist you. Thank you for doing your part to protect our children and vulnerable adults!

### COVID QUESTIONS ANSWERED: WHY CAN'T SE SING IN CHURCH WITH MASKS ON?



Answer: Currently Door County infection rates are very high. Singing creates aerosols which can spray through our masks. We are following the advice of the Moravian Music Foundation, Local Public Health and Wisconsin Council of Churches. We are cautious, not only for our sake, but for the sake of the community in which we live. When it is deemed safe, we will sing with abandon!
