I was a King once. Yes, I really was! I was ten years old, and it was time for the Children's Christmas program at First Lutheran Church in Humboldt, Iowa. That was the night of my coronation. All was going well except when the woman helping with my costume, placed the crown on my head by threading the needle through my scalp! Undaunted, I proudly marched down the aisle singing "We Three Kings" with gusto. My prize was one of those great big Red Delicious Apples.

What on earth made me think of this? It's because this is "The Feast of Christ the King", the last Sunday of the church year.

Psalm 93 Proclaims: "The Lord is King; he is robed in majesty". As much as we shout for joy about Jesus our King, it is the human condition to try to dethrone him. We are too pious to say such a thing out loud. But think of how we follow dangerous ideologies which beckon us, or revere money, which has been awarded sainthood. You get the point. So much for Christ the King! We are, therefore, doomed to failure.

But what about those Red Delicious Apples? They remind us that the One, the King, born at Christmas, will shed his blood to forgive us the sin of attempting to make ourselves the rulers.
