Reflection - Pastor Dan G. Olson

Over the years I have discovered you cannot arm-wrestle someone into Faith, Belief or an escape from bad theology. Honesty demands me to say I fail miserably with these tasks. When confronted with skepticism or outright unbelief I tend to shed my wonderful, peaceful demeanor and get all ballistic and defensive. It's time then to roll out all my Biblical and theological artillery and throw them like hand grenades at the hordes of the unfaithful.

It doesn't work, never has and never will. We are confronted with a different choice: If were peer into God's Word in Luke 4, we are told about the beginning of Jesus' ministry: "In the synagogue of his youth, as Jesus stood up, He was handed the book of Isaiah and read 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He has anointed me to preach good news to the poor'." It goes on from there, of course, but this is enough to get the point.

Are you afraid to share your faith in Jesus? Out loud? To a family member? A friend or stranger? Yeah, me too. Really, I'm no more anointed (or ordained, if you will) than anyone else. All of us are called to ministry. At our Baptism, God both claims us and sends us. Then we share our faith like Jesus did: Say it and then sit down. Let the Holy Spirit do the rest. No argument needed.
