What do you think God wants for you?

Today's scripture reading from the prophet Isaiah seems out of place in the middle of the Lenten season, a time when Christian tradition emphasizes giving up things we enjoy as a reminder of all that Jesus gave up for us. It is also a good time to remember that Jesus came into the world as a human being to teach us what abundant life can be like, even in the most stark, harsh realities.

Consider all the beautiful images we have of Jesus spending time with friends, his disciples and family, gathered around the table, sharing meals and time together. It is a little surprising to remember that Jesus never had a home of his own once he started his public ministry. He relied on the kindness of those who supported him and his work to provide the most basic necessities of life: food and shelter. His world was harsh, brutal, and dangerous, but he lived an extravagant life in his relationships.

God provides so extravagantly for us too, in both physical and spiritual ways. We are blessed with varieties of work, food, drink, natural landscapes, architecture, and artistic expressions that delight all of our senses. God provides, and gives us the freedom to choose what we like.

Spiritual provision abounds in our scriptures, the lives of our ancestors, the prayers we hear, speak and sing. The Lord's Prayer is an abiding treasure we say together each week, reminding us that God's presence and forgiveness never end.

While sacrificing something we enjoy, that we may also take for granted, can be quite freeing, it can be an act of repentance that creates a path to something more than we ever imagined. "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts."

God has simple pleasures and big dreams for us and is happy to abundantly share it all.
