#### Reflection – Rev. Cory Kemp

Our poor, dear Pharisees and scribes had a very difficult time dealing with Jesus. On the one hand, they wanted to hear what he had to say.

But on the other hand, they didn't want to tolerate being around, you know, those tax-collectors and sinners who also came near to listen to him. They grumbled about it, probably within earshot of those they were spurning.

So Jesus, rather than be pulled off track by their complaints, took the best possible advantage of the situation and instead told them a parable about a wayward son coming home, full of contrition, who was welcomed by a joyous father who thought his son was dead. The Pharisees and scribes, who stayed and listened, had apparently reconciled themselves to being seen among the riff raff and putting up with some of Jesus' quirky stories.

The kind of reconciliation that Paul writes about, in his second letter to the church at Corinth, is a return to full union in reestablishing a relationship with repentance, forgiveness and celebration. This is a new creation. "So, if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!"

It's so interesting to be working our way through this Lenten wilderness, moving toward Holy Week, while we are coming out of a pandemic and helping Ukraine survive in its defiant, proud rebuke of oppressive invaders. What new creation, by God's grace and power, is emerging through us and among us? Make no mistake, it is a time for miracles, and we are helping to bring them into being.
