Our "COLIN & FRIENDS" concert series begins ONE WEEK FROM TODAY! Colin will be joined by various accomplished musical guests to perform works of instrumental, vocal, piano and organ music at the Ephraim Moravian Church. The inaugural concert is on:

Sunday May 22nd at 2:00 p.m.

Continuing our exciting celebration of the music of Florence Price, this concert features pianist Betsy DiFelice (a regular with the New Jersey Symphony and the New York Philharmonic, and who for 35 years led the piano department at Princeton University), and our own beloved Cynthia Stiehl, mezzo-soprano.



The program contrasts with that of the concert on May 13th, and explores a different aspect of Florence Price's music; her



songs and piano works, including her arrangements for four-hand piano. Cyndy will also sing songs by Dvorak. Framing the concert will be two major organ works: J.S. Bach's celebrated masterpiece, the "Passacaglia and Fugue in C Minor," and the fascinating, rambunctious Organ Sonata No.1 of Florence Price, written some 200 years later.
