#### A Slice of Heaven – Reflection by Kathleen Harris Revelation 21: 10 and 22: 22-25

Who remembers taking a bite of their favorite pie only to exclaim, "This is a slice of heaven!"? Today's reading from the Book of Revelation shows us a slice of heaven. According to some Bible scholars, the words are mystic metaphors of a post-apocalyptic world. Written in the first century, at a time and place when people in authority violently persecuted Christians, Revelation tells us that behind earthly chaos God is in control, as is the slain Lamb (Rev 5:6).

Revelation's "end time" culminates with a return to the beginning. Vivid descriptions of "the holy city Jerusalem" symbolize the qualities good people will experience in the new earth and the new heaven. The gates will always be open and open to all. Depraved cruelty and wicked lies cannot enter. The temple is gone, for God is ever present. The servants, the people, worship and know God for they "see his face" clearly; it is illuminated by God through a lamp, Jesus the Lamb. With such glorious light, the sun and moon are no longer needed to dispel crippling darkness. Eden's tree of life is there, too, with abundant fruit. It grows alongside a sparkling river that flows from the throne of God, as well as the Lamb, right through the center of the holy city. The tree's leaves provide "healing for the nations."

Revelation offers us a future of eternal bliss, but first we must slog through the sometimes confusing, sometimes joyful present of earthbound lives. In the words of Revelation, we can turn away from worldly "dragons and beasts" and instead choose love and wisdom. As servants of God with the Lamb as our light, we can one day walk through open gates into a renewed world.

Cyndy will also sing songs by Dvorak. Framing the concert will be two major organ works: J.S. Bach's celebrated masterpiece, the "Passacaglia and Fugue in C Minor," and the

fascinating, rambunctious **Organ Sonata No.1** of Florence Price, written some 200 years later.
