



January – June Report of the Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees is charged with the Physical and Fiduciary entities of our Church Building, Parsonage, Grounds and Cemetery. Your Board of Trustees for 2022 are: Natalie Neddersen, President; Carly Mulliken, Secretary, Tad Dukehart, Rob Meyer & Gunilla Wilson.

At the Church Council, an issue was raised concerning our donations to other charities, in the hope that we would be able to give more of a percentage of our yearly income. In the absence of Fund-raising committee activities due to Covid, the Trustees have distributed the following funds to local and one International Charity: \$2,000 each to: HELP of Door County (which assists victims of Domestic Violence); Door CANcer (monetary assistance for Cancer patients); Secret Santa (energy assistance to local families); Door of Life Food Pantry (24 hour, anonymous food pick up) and Uganda Moravian Church Piggery (which enables women to provide a living for their families).

Cherry Scholarship- Since we did not have anyone apply from our own membership, the Trustees reached out to Gibraltar H.S. to see if there were any students in financial need. Two students were identified and received the scholarship. In a thank you note, one of the students said, 'This means so much to me. It is a gift of hope.'

Purchases- A new copier for the church office- the copier is more efficient and our maintenance agreement less expensive than previous years. A new washer for the Parsonage- the cost to repair the old one was prohibitive. A Water Dispenser (located in the kitchen) to cut down on plastic bottles.

Cemetery - the Trustees hired Kathleen Harris to assist the Cemetery Superintendent. She is in the process of updating files, cleaning stones, and helping the Trustees identify ways to steward the property.

The Trustees are working on updating offering counting procedures (scheduling a second person for joint accounting of weekly giving per denomination protocol; succession planning; ensuring that our scholarship protocols are up to date, re-writing job descriptions; preparing an extensive list of needed maintenance items and capital projects/replacements, strengthening our live-streaming capabilities, etc.

The Trustees wish to thank all of those who came out for our interior work day. It is gratifying to see so many invested in creating a clean, safe environment for all those entering our building!

January – June Report Board of Elders

The Board of Elders is charged with the Spiritual life of the congregation, which includes all programming and the use of the Building/Grounds. The elders coordinate Lay Readers and Ushers for Sunday morning services and assist with special services and funerals. The members of the 2022 Board of Elders are: Pastor Dawn Volpe, Chair; Sherry Moore, Vice Chair; Linda Carey, Secretary; Cici Mulliken; Tiggy Shields, Summer Elder; and Kathy Zehner.

The elders were faced with the daunting challenge of providing a safe environment for Worship Services, Sunday School and the groups which meet during the week. We decided that the best way to ensure safety was to keep mask mandates in place, regardless of the risk level assigned to a particular week. We concluded that lifting masking during low risk times, only to put them in place during medium to high risk levels would lead to confusion. Since Moravians love to sing, and singing creates higher risk of viral spread, leaving masks in place allows us to engage in this activity. We are also concerned about the people in our congregation who had been isolated due to underlying medical conditions. It would be tragic if our beloved members could not worship in person due to higher risk of contagion. Wearing masks enables all to worship together. We will maintain this posture for the foreseeable future.

Other Highlights:

- The Board collaborated with Midsummer Music and the Ephraim Historic Foundation in a concert featuring the music of Florence Price.
- -The Board welcomed the Rev. Greg Behrend as he presented the Ministry "You Belong".
- Approved a Chess Group for all ages, meeting on Thursdays
- Endorsed the Emerging Ministries Workshop which was attended by Pastor Dawn and Angela Sherman
- Sponsored the Prayer Service for Ukraine (held at Shepherd of the Bay Lutheran) and approved the consumable collections at the church.

Wisconsin Help for Homeowners Program

Governor Tony Evers has announced that more than \$92 million dollars in assistance s available through the American Rescue Plan Act. It's a new state program to assist with mortgage

payments, property taxes and utility bills.

The program grew out of the Treasurer's Homeowners Task Force that State Senator Sarah Godlewski organized, and it's available to Wisconsin homeowners in single-family residencs, condos, duplexes or factory built home as a primary residence, have experienced a qualified financial hardship after January 21, 2020, and earn a household income at or below 100% of the area median income.

The program is administered by Lakeshore CAP at homeownershelp.wi.gov. A call center offers info at 1-855-2-HOME-WI and will also send out applications (the application runs 21 pages but is simple to complete).



The Moravian Ministries Foundation has many tools to help Moravian Churches - and individual Moravians - with their retirement and gift planning. The Trustees will be getting that information for us all.

In the meantime, here is the MMF's new Will Planning Wizard. It's an easy, online tool that helps your members get organized in preparation to establish or update their will with their attorney.
