## June 12, 2022 Trinity Sunday - Pastor Dawn Volpe

Doctrines give me a headache. It's not that they are unimportant. They are the product of much study, debate and nuance. But so often the philosophical debates take me away from the things which are truly important. I've tried to understand this particular doctrine for years, but reading scholarly articles adds to my confusion. What I do know is that the Trinity attempts to explain the unfathomable. How do we speak of God? How do we approach the Transcendent? We do this by the many descriptions and characteristics of God that our language can supply. In the Trinitarian understanding, we are beneficiaries of a Loving Father-Creator, a Selfless Son-Savior and an Illuminating Spirit-Sustainer.

We will never possess a complete, perfect understanding of God in our finite existence. We must wait for the moment when we step into life eternal. Until that time, although we may not know fully, although we may be confused by things too awesome for our intellect, we are beneficiaries of all the Grace, all the Light we will ever need.
