"Juneteenth" - Pastor Dawn Volpe

Today we celebrate 2 holidays- Father's Day and Juneteenth. Father's Day is well established and we delight in honoring the men in our lives. Although Juneteenth has been observed since 1886, it became a national holiday just last year.

The name Juneteenth is a clever amalgam of June 19th. It is a day which remembers the long road to freedom and the significant accomplishments of the African American community.

We often cite the Emancipation Proclamation as the seminal document which freed all enslaved people in the United States. However, there were over 200,000 people in Texas who remained in bondage 2 years after the Proclamation. On June 19, 1885, the Union Army finally arrived in Texas with enough manpower to enforce the law. The General of the Army informed the citizens through street proclamations. Joy broke loose as each community shared the news. A year later, the holiday, Juneteenth, was born.

On the Juneteenth website, https://www.juneteenth.com/history/
we read about a particularly winsome tradition: Dress was also an important element in early Juneteenth customs and is often still taken seriously, particularly by the direct descendants who can make the connection to this tradition's roots. During slavery there were laws on the books in many areas that prohibited or limited the dressing of the enslaved. During the initial days of the emancipation celebrations, there are accounts of former slaves tossing their ragged garments into the creeks and rivers and adorning themselves with clothing taken from the plantations belonging to their former 'masters.'

I am reminded of the many scriptures which link new clothes with a new way of being. In Isaiah (61:3) God promises to give us a "'Garment of Praise' in place of a faint spirit." In the book of Revelation, we are promised to be clothed in sparkling white. In Paul's letters we are urged to dress in the virtues of love and kindness. May we all step into God's freedom, robed in Joy this day!
