



From a Pastor's Desk





The way may not be obvious or easy. Pitfalls could abound and you may be derailed a few times. You may come out the other end with some bumps and bruises. You may want to give up or be temporarily scared away, unable to move forward. But, if you keep after it and stay on course, you will achieve your goal.

Sounds like a lot of work, doesn't it?

Most things worth having do take a good bit of work, and usually aren't easy to accomplish. While that can be very, very frustrating at times, there is a tremendous amount of satisfaction to be gained going through the process and coming out the other side.

But the Apostle Paul hinted at there being another available resource always at hand to make the process at least a little easier, even on the most challenging projects and activities. Paul wrote to the Philippian congregation, saying, "Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for God is at work in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure." Philippians 2: 12-13

Your own salvation is a good-sized chunk of work, a lifetime's abundance really, and well worth the effort, don't you think? If you or I were relying only on what we know or our force of will to find a way to salvation, we would be at a loss quite quickly. Would we even have the will to get started? If we did have the will, where would we start?

It feels significantly easier, much less burdensome, to know that God is at work in each of us, all of us, both to strengthen and guide not only our will, but also the work that manifests that will to create a mutually satisfying relationship with God for God's good pleasure for all of humanity. The attention you and I pay to working out our salvation is a life-time investment with God who supports us with so much more than we can create on our own or even imagine.



Board of World Mission News

The Board of World Mission takes this opportunity to thank the many congregations and individuals who have donated to our Moravian Disaster Relief Fund over these past few months. We have raised over \$300,000 (US) to assist congregations in the Czech Republic and Germany as they extend hospitality to refugees fleeing violence in Ukraine. Your donations have helped provide housing, food, and critical supplies to folks who are in crisis. It has assisted one congregation in helping relocate a primary school from Kyiv to their town. Your donations have also helped congregations in places like Herrnhut to provide language classes, meals, and assistance in finding housing.

We look forward to assisting additional schools in the Czech Republic to welcome refugees into their student bodies. We now know that some refugees are making their way to the United States and Canada. Moravian congregations in Southern Wisconsin are now connecting with Ukrainian families who were hosted by Moravians in the Czech Republic and are being settled for up to two years in the Madison, WI area. The BWM can help your congregation if it wants to get involved with hosting refugee families.



Residents will remember **Addie Crum** from her work in the church and Crum's Showcase and the beautiful clothes she sold there. The Seiler family has been in Door County for over 160 years.

Bernice Koehler played the organ at our church from age 12 until her retirement and was always involved in church activities. The family owned Lang's Resort and later, Bernice worked at our post office.

Ivan Thorp was President of the Village for many years; his folks built the Eagle Inn in 1908 and he ran the Eagle Inn Docks (now the Ephraim Yacht Club). He took over the Eagle Inn in 1942 and was our second Fyr Bal Chieftain.

Come to the church after your tour to see photos, artifacts, and get some refreshments! Then join in the **hymn playing by Colin Welford and discussions of their origins** at either 2 p.m. or 3 p.m.
