RECOGNIZE GOD'S GIFTS – Barbara Axelson

The Prophet Habakkuk (1: 1 - 4 & 2: 1 - 4) pleads with God to relieve him of observing wrong-doing, helplessly looking on at his troubled world - a very long time ago. An ancient plea which resonates during modern times. We often wonder, what's next?!

The Lord's answer then (and now): write the vision for the 'appointed time'. That is... a time appointed by God, not by us or by Habakkuk. How can we bear this? We are told, "if it seems to tarry (to be drastically delayed), wait for it.

Yes, Lord, we wait - you have told us the righteous live by faith. May it be so!

In Paul's letter to his dear friend Timothy, he offers him three gifts, which undergird us as we wait for deliverance: grace (unearned), mercy (love's response to our failings) and peace; peace... not just 'good luck' or 'smooth sailing', or 'chill!' But Peace which transcends circumstances. Peace which anchors us. These gifts are given by our Creator - our inheritance as God's children, as heirs of the beloved son.

Paul reminds Timothy that because we are God's beloved children, the spirit of power, love, and self discipline has been conferred on us. When we are troubled with the world's ills, we put our trust in the Good News - not our own abilities. We are beneficiaries of the Blessed Trinity. Go Forward!
