## The Good Shepherd - Kathleen Harris

What does story of The Good Shepherd tell us about our relationship with God?

- The world has many shepherds, but Jesus (God incarnate) is *the* shepherd.
- This shepherd is *good*.
- The Good Shepherd knows when we are lost and calls us each by name.
- Each of us are worth rescuing because each one of us matters.
- We know the shepherd's voice, but must listen for it, too.
- When the shepherd leaves to rescue a lost lamb, the flock should stay together.

To arrive at rich pastures, we must enter through a gate. The shepherd walks ahead of the sheep towards it. The sheep follow. The shepherd is compassionate, but the gate is a worrisome thing. A gatekeeper stands there, ready to open the latch.

What do the gate and gatekeeper represent? If the gatekeeper is God, does the gate symbolize prayerful lives of kind actions? Does the gatekeeper ever unfasten the latch for the wayward, lone sheep who left the flock and now, bleating mournfully, is trying to scramble over the fence? And what of other shepherds who benevolently lead flocks. Are heavenly pastures reserved only for followers of The Good Shepherd?

The warmhearted story of The Good Shepherd is remarkable for its simple truths, but even more compelling for its deeper mysteries.
