## From the Pastor's Desk "Transitions"



I dislike moving. Although excited about the future possibilities of each move... college, first job, seminary and 3 churches...the act of moving itself is fraught with grief, work, aggravation, aches and pains. It all came back to me when assisting my son in his move from one apartment to another. Granted, his move did not entail leaving a state or even a neighborhood. He was simply moving to a different building in the same complex. But it was still arduous.

Moving from a living space, whether large or small is filled with so many decisions- what must be kept, given or thrown away, how many boxes will we need (since belongings seem to procreate at will, the answer is usually double what we estimated), how to stage everything and how to manuever without causing ourselves injury. Moving entails cleaning the space we left, which takes hours... It's amazing how much detritus accumulates over the years.

Once our belongings are in the new space, we have to figure out how/where to place it all, perhaps with regret that we didn't do a more thorough purge. We really don't begin to relax until we are completely settled.

While assisting Robert, I was reminded of the difficulty we have with any transition, even welcoming a new year. In order to walk into an unknown future, it might be helpful to think of it in terms of a household move. What should we retain from past experiences? What needs to be given away? What no longer serves us? And, most importantly, will we be any better, as people, as a community, because of the actions we take?

Although I cannot answer these questions for you, I am convinced that we do not walk into the future alone. Jesus said, "I am with you always, even to the end of the age." In times of transition, when we are between what was and what is to come, we are promised a grace-filled companion. May the Spirit of Christ grant us assurance as we 'move' into 2023.
