Reflection – Pastor Dan G. Olson

We live in a world full of spam, scams, schemes, false advertising, robocalls, bait-and-switch, and politicians. Probably as never before, we are inundated with those selling barrels of snake oil. It is unfortunate when people fall prey to those charlatans who lie and deceive in order to fleece the unsuspecting. It is natural to be wary. Then steps in the caveat of "Seeing is believing!" We would love to trust the words we hear and the people who say them, but show your credentials.

Even though John the Baptist was in the crowbar hotel, he had been hearing rumors. They were about a Messiah. John had been preparing a way for a Messiah, but when He shows up, can it possibly be true? Is Jesus the real deal? Better check this out! So Jesus answers, "What do you see? The blind receive their sight, the lame walk, lepers are healed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised."

So it is with us. Like John, we might well be skeptical. But in this Advent season we learn to prepare, or maybe repair, our minds and spirits and souls.

Perhaps we might say, "Believing is Seeing." When our Lord captures us in belief, our eyes are opened to see Him as He truly is: Immanuel, God with us.

"Lord, I believe. Help Thou my unbelief."
