Reflection by Pastor Dan G. Olson

"How could she have done such a thing?" Joseph might have thought. Here they were, Mary and Joseph, in love with each other. Engaged even. And Mary shows up pregnant? "Oh, dear God in Heaven!" Joseph might have said, and "I had nothing to do with it." It seemed to Joseph the only clear path was to break the engagement, to quietly divorce her. But the agony of that had Joseph's heart, mind and soul tied up in knots. What to do? Best to sleep on it.

Then our Lord used that sleep time dream to talk directly into Joseph's ear. Dreams seem to be God's favorite form of communication.

Of course the centerpiece of Christmas time is the birth of Jesus. But on the night of Joseph's dream there was a birthing as real as Christmas Eve. It was the birth of a father for the Son of God. In his dreaming state, Joseph allowed God to speak to the depths of his heart and to offer a resolution to his dilemma about Mary that his human reason could not solve.

On this night, as much as on Christmas Eve, and angel hovered near, whispering a message from God into Joseph's dreams. The angel showed Joseph the visions of a boy growing and becoming strong.

"Here," whispered the angel, "is the key that unlocks your dilemma, Joseph. Believe Mary. Marry her and become the father of God's child. He will need a father like you to be accepted by others as he grows to manhood. He will need not just not any father, but a father like you, Joseph, capable of nurturing him, and giving a name – 'Immanuel, God with us!"
