Second Sunday in Advent

I stand accused of being impatient. I plead guilty. Where, along the way, this trait developed within me, I can't quite say. It can be a defect of character at one moment and a strength in the next. For me to wait is absolutely excruciating. I'm really big into instant gratification.

Now we have arrived at the season of anticipation. Christmas is around the corner so it's "get ready, get set ... wait!" The table has been set for a huge serving of angst. Will we be ready in time for the big day? We are reminded on Labor Day Weekend, it seems, to get ready to commit first degree shopping. We set ourselves up for a prolonged time of pacing the floor. Will Christmas never arrive?

If all this isn't bad enough, the tradition of the Church has given us the liturgical season of Advent. It is designed to give us space to prepare our hearts and minds for the arrival of The Messiah, Jesus our Lord. The very first Biblical prophecy, prediction and promise of a Savior is found in Genesis 3:15. "And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel."
