Reflection for the Epiphany... What to do with our AHA moments

Then you shall see and be radiant, and your heart shall be startled and become enlarged. The prophet Isaiah, whose land was plunged into deep darkness by marauding nations, much like the people of Ukraine are experiencing, had an 'aha' moment. Stirred by the Spirit of God, he saw a golden age for his people. The nation would rise to prominence and wealth. In faith, Isaiah told his people to act as if the promise was already fulfilled- arise, shine! He told them that when the new age came, their collective heart would be 'startled and enlarged'-in other words, their vision, their perspective would break open to receive this new reality.

We know, from the scripture reading today, that an AHA moment came to Herod and the religious leaders when the Sages arrived at their doorstep. The visitors only knew that a new prince had been born. But Herod immediately understood that the new prince was the Messiah, the one promised by the prophets and longed for by the nation. We know what Herod did with his AHA moment. He tried to kill the Christ Child. He was willing to destroy the future to secure his present status as king. The religious leaders also knew that a Messiah had been born, but they were so frightened by Herod (who was known for his homicidal ways) and perhaps, by the disruption of the status quo, that they did absolutely nothing with their AHA moment. They let the opportunity pass. No one hitched a ride with the Sages' caravan.

What do you do with your AHA moments. We receive minor and major Epiphanies throughout our lifetime. We can allow them to enlarge our perspective, we can allow them to inform and clarify, or we can work against them, especially if we find them unsettling. We are promised that the Spirit of God will guide us into truth, if we are open to the blessed Epiphanies sent by the hand of a gracious God.
