Reflection by Pastor Dan G. Olson

Just recently I was a patient at one of our esteemed local hospitals. "Patient" is a good word for it because the word "patience" comes from the worst "to suffer." I went in to have something fixed in my spine. I came home worse than when I went in, and now it's painful to walk from my man cave to the kitchen. So, I thought about changing the word "patient" to guest. That seems to have a nice ring to it. Yes, I know that in the fullness of time I'll heal, but in the meantime, I've become irascible in the extreme.

"Guest" may seem an odd word to use. Why, as a guest, would I rack up tens of thousands of hospital bills? If we invite friends as guests for dinner some night, do we give them a bill at the end of a meal? There is something special about being a guest, really. It means that you are fully invested in the activity to which you have been invited.

All of this can apply to our walk as followers of Jesus. We have been invited to join the faith journey as guests of the One who sets before us the table upon which we find the gifts of forgiveness and strength, the gifts of wholeness and healing, the gift of an eternal banquet. To be guests of our Lord has come at a great price, of course - the life and suffering of Jesus. Though there is nothing in all creation we can do for the salvation Jesus provides, we are, nevertheless, full participants in the mission of the Gospel. As it says in

1 Corinthians, "We are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, God's building." Even if that building requires renovation now and again.
